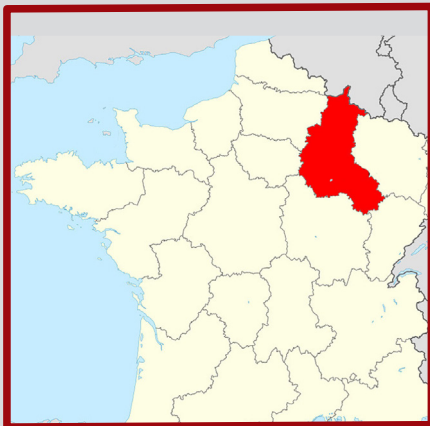
# ABOUT BUBBLES

Sparkling wine is a wine with significant levels of carbon dioxide in it, making it fizzy. Commonly called champagne, EU countries legally reserve that term for products exclusively produced in the Champagne region of France. The sweetness of sparkling wine can range from very dry brut styles to sweeter doux varieties.

The sparkling quality of these wines comes from its carbon dioxide content and may be the result of natural fermentation, either in a bottle, as with the traditional method, in a large tank designed to withstand the pressures involved (as in the Charmat process), or as a result of simple carbon dioxide injection in some cheaper sparkling wines.

## “Champagne”

The word “champagne” is reserved by law only for sparkling wine from the Champagne region of France. The French terms Mousseux and Crémant refer to sparkling wine not made in the Champagne region, such



as Blanquette de Limoux produced in Southern France. Sparkling wines are produced around the world, and are often referred to by their local name or region, such as Espumante from Portugal, Cava from Spain, and Prosecco from Italy.

## Grower Champagne

Grower Champagne is sparkling wine that is both made in the Champagne region, but is also specifically producers that grow and bottle their own wine. This makes a truly unique expression of terroir, as you get complete vineyard to bottle quality control and craftsmanship.

Sabine Godmé and her husband Jean Marie Guillaume are 4th generation growers in the heart of Montagne de Reims, specifically in the Grand Cru village of Verzenay. All the viticulture here is sustainable and on average 30% of the primary fermentation is done in barrel.

For more than 15 generations the Arlaux family has passionately worked and produced wine in the Premier Cru village of Vrigny. Arlaux Brut Nature is a pure expression of the naked fruit. Its clean and frank attack on the palate, its aromas of apples and cooked grapes, its notes of buttered bread and its long finish echo the exceptional quality of the selected grapes and its perfect and long ageing on lees. The Brut Rosé, with light notes of crushed raspberries, delicate aromas of white flowers, it has the nobility of great wines and seduces the most expert noses.

# ABOUT CHARDONNAY

Chardonnay is a green-skinned grape variety used in the production of white wine. The variety originated in the Burgundy wine region of eastern France, but is now grown wherever wine is produced, from England to New Zealand.

The Chardonnay grape itself is neutral, with many of the flavors commonly associated with the grape being derived from such influences as terroir and oak. In cool climates, Chardonnay tends to be medium to light body with noticeable acidity and flavors of green plum, apple, and pear. In warmer locations, the flavors become more citrus, peach, and melon, while in very warm locations, more fig and tropical fruit notes such as banana and mango come out.

Chardonnay has a wide-ranging reputation for relative ease of cultivation and ability to adapt to different conditions. It is a highly vigorous vine, with extensive leaf cover which can inhibit the energy and nutrient uptake of its grape clusters. Vineyard managers counteract this with aggressive pruning and canopy management. When Chardonnay vines are planted densely, they are forced to compete for resources and funnel energy into their grape clusters.

## ABOUT SAUVIGNON BLANC

Sauvignon blanc is a green-skinned grape variety that originates from the Bordeaux region of France. The grape gets its name from the French words sauvage (“wild”) and blanc (“white”) due to its early origins as an indigenous grape in South West France. Sauvignon blanc is planted in many of the world’s wine regions, producing a crisp, dry, and refreshing white varietal wine.

## ABOUT PINOT GRIGIO

Pinot gris is thought to be a mutant clone of the pinot noir variety, it normally has a grayish-blue fruit, but the grapes can have a brownish pink to black and even white appearance. Pinot grigio from New World wine regions have moderate to low acidity, higher alcohol levels and an almost “oily” texture making it more full-bodied. In Italy, Pinot grigio grapes are often harvested early to retain the refreshing acidity and minimize some of the overt-fruitiness of the variety, creating a more neutral flavor profile.

## ABOUT REISLING

Riesling is an aromatic grape variety displaying flowery, almost perfumed, aromas as well as high acidity. It is used to make dry, semi-sweet, sweet, and sparkling white wines. It is a variety which is highly terroir-expressive. In cool climates, Riesling wines tend to exhibit apple and tree fruit notes with noticeable levels of acidity that are balanced with residual sugar. A late-ripening variety that can develop more citrus and peach notes is grown in warmer climates.

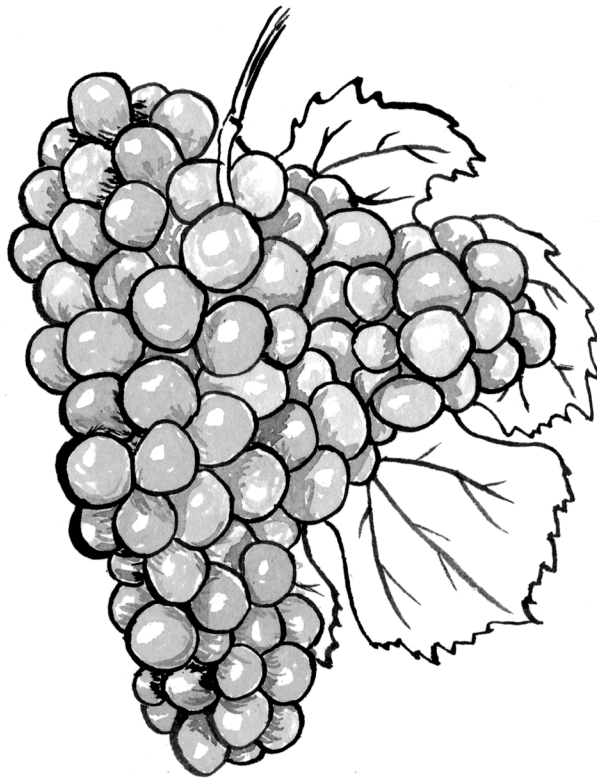

# ABOUT PINOT NOIR

The name “pinot noir” comes from the French words for pine and black. The word pine alludes to the grape variety having tightly clustered, pine cone-shaped bunches of fruit.

Pinot noir grapes are grown around the world, mostly in the cooler climates, and the grape is chiefly associated with the Burgundy region of France.

Pinot noir is a difficult variety to cultivate and transform into wine. The grape’s tendency to produce tightly packed clusters makes it susceptible to several viticultural hazards involving rot that require diligent canopy management. When young, wines made from pinot noir tend to have red fruit aromas of cherries, raspberries and strawberries. As the wine ages, pinot has the potential to develop more vegetal and “barnyard” aromas that can contribute to the complexity of the wine.

## ABOUT RED BLENDS

Red wine has been prevalent since prehistory (the period before written records) as winemaking originated and spread throughout the world. In this case, “red blend” refers to any red wine that contains more than one red grape variety in the final product, though certain red blends can have their own designation as varietal wines despite comprising multiple grapes.

For much of the history of European wine, red blends were in fact more common than single varietals, as winemaking was typically region-centric and featured grapes consolidated from vineyards across a given area. One famous example of this practice is the Bordeaux blend, which originated in the 18th or 19th century and usually comprises Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc.

## ABOUT CABERNET SAUVIGNON

Cabernet Sauvignon is one of the world’s most widely recognized red wine grape varieties. It is grown in nearly every major wine producing country. Cabernet became internationally recognized through its prominence in Bordeaux wines where it is often blended with Merlot and Cabernet Franc. From France, the grape spread across Europe and to the New World where it found new homes in places like California’s Santa Cruz Mountains and Napa Valley.

Despite its prevalence in the industry, the grape is a relatively new variety, the product of a chance crossing between Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon blanc during the 17th century in southwestern France. Its popularity is often attributed to its ease of cultivation – the grapes have thick skins and the vines are hardy and naturally low yielding, budding late to avoid frost and resistant to viticultural hazards such as rot and insects.

The classic profile of Cabernet tends to be full-bodied wines with high tannins and noticeable acidity that contributes to the wine’s aging potential. Cooler climates produce wines with blackcurrant notes that can be accompanied by green bell pepper notes. Moderate climates the blackcurrant notes are often seen with black cherry and black olive notes while in very hot climates the currant flavors can veer towards the over-ripe and “jammy” side.

# THE JUDGMENT OF PARIS

It was the tasting that revolutionized the wine world.

On May 24, 1976, the crème de la crème of the French wine establishment sat in judgment for a blind tasting that pitted some of the finest wines in France against unknown California bottles. Everyone assumed that the French would win every competition.

To everyone's amazement, the California wines – red and white – beat out their French competitors. The 1976 judgment totally changed the game. And it wasn't just California that was transformed. The results gave winemakers everywhere a reason to believe that they too could take on the greatest wines in the world.

## ABOUT ZINFANDEL

Zinfandel (also known as Primitivo) is a variety of black-skinned wine grape. The grapes typically produce a robust red wine. Red berry fruit flavors like raspberry predominate in wines from cooler areas, whereas blackberry, anise and pepper notes are more common in wines made in warmer areas.

## ABOUT MERLOT

Merlot is a dark blue-colored wine grape variety, that is used as both a blending grape and for varietal wines. Its softness and “fleshiness”, combined with its earlier ripening, makes Merlot a popular grape for blending with the sterner, later-ripening Cabernet Sauvignon, which tends to be higher in tannins.

## SHIRAZ, SYRAH & SIRAH

The modern “Shiraz” grape is identical to Syrah and originated in southeast France.

Syrah and Petite Sirah are two different varieties with very different flavor compositions. Syrah is older and originates from the northern Rhone region in France and produces flavors of dark fruits, sometimes smoke, meat (particularly bacon), leather and a white pepper finish.

Petite Sirah is a much younger variety. It's a very late ripening grape with a thin skin more susceptible to the ravages of late season rains. Petite Sirah is a big bold red with strong tannins. The bouquet has herbal and black pepper overtones and typically offers flavors of blue fruit, black fruit, and plums.

## ABOUT TEMPRANILLO

Tempranillo is a black grape variety widely grown to make full-bodied red wines. Its name is the diminutive of the Spanish *temprano* (“early”), a reference to the fact that it ripens several weeks earlier than most Spanish red grapes.

Tempranillo has a relatively neutral profile so it is often blended with other varieties, such as Grenache and Carignan, or aged for extended periods in oak where the wine easily takes on the flavor of the barrel. Varietal examples of Tempranillo usually exhibit flavors of plum and strawberries.

## ABOUT MALBEC

Malbec is a purple grape variety that has an inky dark color and robust tannins. It is increasingly celebrated as an Argentine varietal wine and is being grown around the world.

A popular theory claims that Malbec is named after a Hungarian peasant who first spread the grape variety throughout France.

The Malbec grape is a thin-skinned grape and needs more sun and heat than either Cabernet Sauvignon or Merlot to mature. It ripens mid-season and can bring very deep color, ample tannins, and a particular plum-like flavor component. The wines are rich, dark and juicy.

## ABOUT FRENCH WHITE

Categorised by both grape but mainly by region, French whites can become confusing when you want to know what you’re actually getting in the bottle.

Another country who advocate blending, most grapes are indigenous to France, and as is the case with Sauvignon, Chenin Blanc and Sémillon which are all relied on heavily to create some of the most famous white exports from the country.

Due to the huge amount of exported French white, the Appellation d’origine contrôlée (the French quality assurance board) mark and monitor the quality and percentage of blended types of wine.

## ABOUT FRENCH RED

French wine is produced all throughout France, in quantities between 50 and 60 million hectolitres per year, or 7–8 billion bottles. French wine traces its history to the 6th century BC, with many of France's regions dating their wine-making history to Roman times.

French red wine is considered as a benchmark of quality with its delicate aromas, flavors, and the promise of a beautiful textural experience! Also, when it comes to record-setting auction prices, French red wines are frequently on the forefront as well.

## ABOUT PAUILLAC, FRANCE

Pauillac, a commune located between Saint-Estèphe and Saint-Julien on Bordeaux's Médoc peninsula, is home to some of the world's most famous red wines, made predominantly from Cabernet Sauvignon grape. The total vineyard area of the appellation covers approximately 2950 acres. In addition to Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Carmenère, Petit Verdot and Malbec are also permitted for use under the Pauillac appellation laws.

Three of the top five châteaux in the 1855 Médoc Classification (a ranking of Bordeaux's best wine-producing properties) are located here; Mouton Rothschild, Lafite Rothschild and Château Latour. Over hundreds of vintages, the châteaux and their winemakers have become very skilled at emphasizing the individuality of their vineyards, and there is general agreement that the styles of the top three châteaux are discernibly different.

It is a very stylish, elegant, yet concentrated Lafite Rothschild with an opaque ruby/purple color, soft well-integrated tannins, nice integrated oak, acidity and alcohol. Lafites's 2012 reveals good, opaque, ruby/purple color and plenty of lead pencil and blackcurrant fruit. The wine is medium-bodied and should hit its prime 2020-2035.

# ABOUT ITALIAN WINE

Italy is home to some of the oldest wine-producing regions in the world. Italian wine regions are known for their rich variety of wine styles. Italy, closely followed by Spain and France, is the world's largest wine producer by volume. Its contribution is about 45–50 million hl per year, and represents about one third of global production. Grapes are grown in almost every region of the country and there are more than one million vineyards under cultivation.

Etruscans and Greek settlers produced wine in Italy before the Romans planted their own vineyards in the 2nd century BC. The Romans greatly increased Italy's area under vine using efficient viticultural and winemaking methods, and pioneered large-scale production and storage techniques such as barrel-making and bottling.

### Châteauneuf du Pape

Châteauneuf-du-Pape is one of the best known French wine appellations known for its bold Grenache-based red blends. In 1309, Pope Clement V relocated the office of the pope to Avignon where he started the vineyards of Châteauneuf-du-Pape, and indulged his habit of drinking and enjoying wine. It literally translates to "The Pope's new castle."

## ABOUT PORT

Port wine is a Portuguese fortified wine produced with distilled grape spirits exclusively in the Douro Valley in the northern provinces of Portugal. It is typically a sweet, red wine, often served as a dessert wine, though it also comes in dry, semi-dry, and white varieties. Fortified wines in the style of port are also produced outside Portugal, including in Australia, France, South Africa, Canada, India, Argentina, Spain, and the United States. Under European Union Protected Designation of Origin guidelines, only the product from Portugal may be labeled as port. In the United States, wines labeled “port” may come from anywhere in the world.

## ABOUT DESSERT WINE

There is no simple definition of a dessert wine. In the UK, a dessert wine is considered to be any sweet wine drunk with a meal, as opposed to the white fortified wines (fino and amontillado sherry) drunk before the meal, and the red fortified wines (port and madeira) drunk after it. Thus, most fortified wines are regarded as distinct from dessert wines, but some of the less strong fortified white wines, such as Pedro Ximénez sherry and Muscat de Beaumes-de-Venise, are regarded as honorary dessert wines.

# ABOUT US BOURBON

American made whiskey that is distilled from a mash having at least 51 percent corn, the remainder being grains. Popular grains added to a mash include malt, rye, barley, and wheat. Aging must take place in a new, charred oak barrel. The whiskey cannot enter the barrel at higher than 125 proof, and cannot enter the bottle with a proof of less than 80. After aging, and before bottling, only water may be added. Bourbon is America's only native spirit, declared such by Congress in 1964.

## ORIGINS

Distilling was most likely brought to present-day Kentucky in the late 18th century by Scots and Scots-Irish. The invention of bourbon is often attributed to Elijah Craig (Larceny & Elijah Craig Bourbon), a Baptist minister and distiller who is said to have been the first to age the product in charred oak casks, a process that gives bourbon its reddish color and distinctive taste.

# ABOUT US WHISKEY

American whiskey is a distilled beverage produced in the United States from a fermented mash of cereal grain. Among the types included under this designation are bourbon whiskey, rye whiskey, rye malt whiskey, malt whiskey, wheat whiskey, and corn whiskey. All of these are made from mashes with at least 51% of their named grains.

Also included are blended whiskey, blend of straight whiskeys, grain whiskey, and spirit whiskey, which do not specify a dominant grain, and in the case of blends may include artificial color and flavorings.

To be labeled as one of these, the whiskey must be distilled to not more than 80% alcohol by volume (160 U.S. proof) to ensure that the flavor of the original mash is adequately retained, and the addition of coloring, caramel and flavoring additives is prohibited. All of these except corn whiskey must be aged in charred new oak containers. American corn whiskey does not have to be aged at all – but, if it is aged, it must be aged in used or un-charred oak barrels.

## Texas Bourbon

What defines Texas whiskey? It's certainly the Texas terroir – the dry summer heat and drastic fluctuations in temperature. But perhaps more importantly, it's the trailblazing spirit of the Texans distilling it.

## CANADIAN VS. IRISH

The main ingredients in Irish whiskey are barley, malt and water. Most Canadian whiskies are blended multi-grain liquors containing a large percentage of corn spirits, and are typically lighter and smoother than other whisky styles. Today, as for the past two centuries, the terms “rye whisky” and “Canadian whisky” are used interchangeably in Canada and refer to exactly the same product, which generally is made with only a small amount of rye grain.

## ABOUT JAPANESE WHISKY

Broadly speaking the style of Japanese whisky is more similar to that of Scotch whisky than other major styles of whisky.

The production of Japanese whisky began as a conscious effort to recreate the style of Scotch whisky. Before 2000, the market for Japanese whiskies was almost entirely domestic, though this changed in 2001 when Nikka’s 10-year Yoichi single malt won “Best of the Best” at Whisky Magazine’s awards

## ABOUT RYE WHISKEY

In the United States, “rye whiskey” is, by law, made from a mash of at least 51 percent rye. (The other ingredients of the mash are usually corn and malted barley.) Rye grain is known for imparting what many call a spicy or fruity flavor to the whiskey.

## SINGLE MALT VS. BLENDED

Single malts are the product of a single distillery, with malted barley as the only grain ingredient, whereas a blended scotch whisky is a result of single malt and grain whiskies blended together to create a more well-rounded flavor. The single malts possess a fruity softness with a bit more of a dry finish, whereas a blended Scotch whisky, possesses a more lingering finish.

# ABOUT SINGLE MALT SCOTCH

Single malt Scotch is single malt whisky made in Scotland. The whisky must have been distilled at a single distillery using a pot still distillation process and made from a mash of malted barley. As with any Scotch whisky, a single malt Scotch must be distilled in Scotland and matured in oak casks in Scotland for at least three years and one day. (Most single malts are matured for longer.)

“Malt” indicates that the whisky is distilled from a “malted” barley.

“Single” indicates that all the spirits in the bottle come from a single distillery.

The age statement on a bottle of single malt Scotch is the number of years the whisky spent maturing in casks. Very few whiskies are bottled from a single cask, and the mixing of spirits with different amounts of ageing is allowed; the age statement reflects the age of the youngest whisky in the mix.

## Peat (That Smokey Flavor)

Peat is basically decomposed organic plant matter that has been compressed in the ground for thousands of years, essentially young coal. There is no shortage of peat in Scotland — according to Scottish National Heritage, peat covers approximately 23 percent of the country, mostly in the Highlands and Islands.

Originally, peat was introduced to whisky by Scots who used it to heat the pot stills. However, the “peaty” flavor in Scotch actually comes from the malting process, where the dried barley absorbs the smoke odor from the burning peat used in the drying.

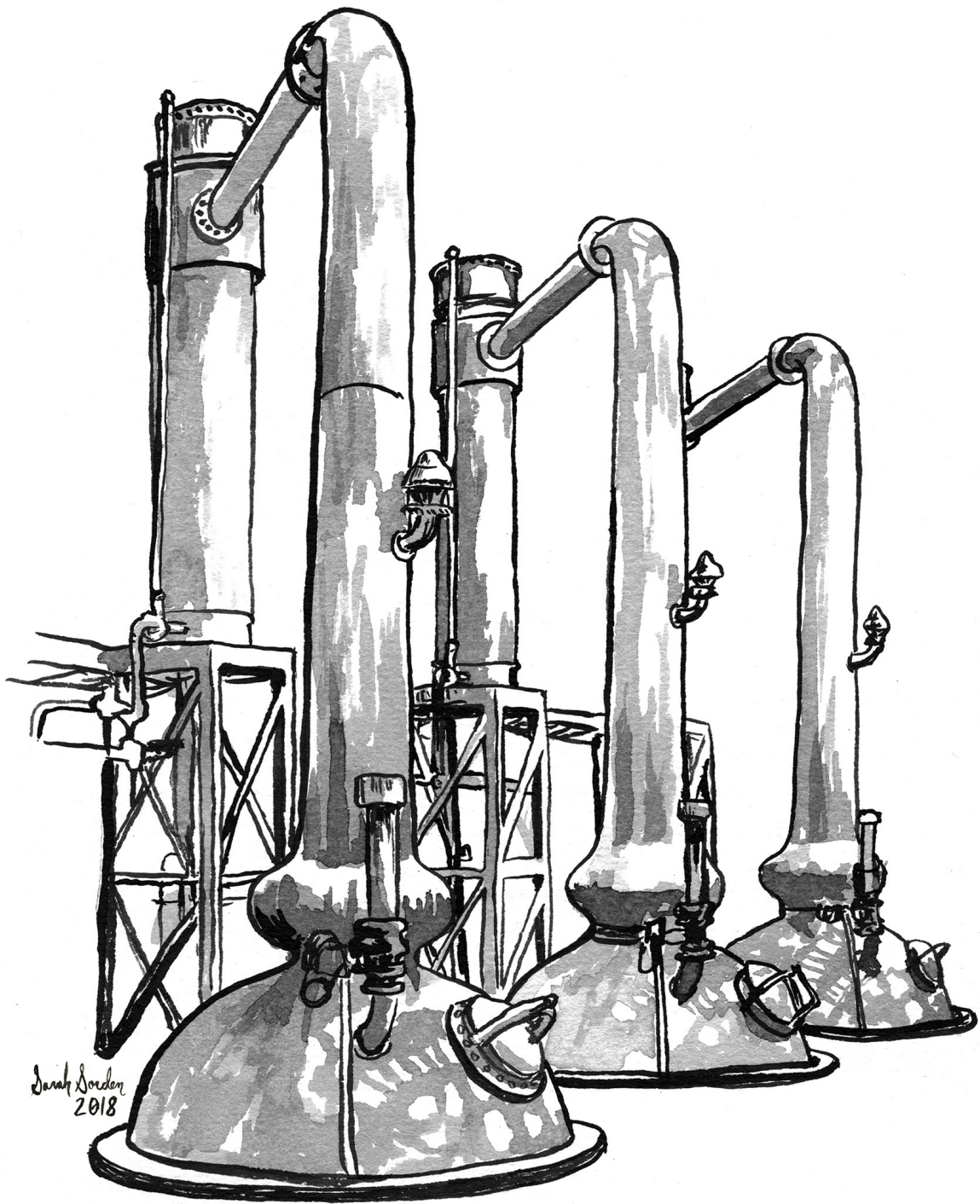

# ABOUT VODKA

Vodka is a distilled beverage composed primarily of water and ethanol, but sometimes with traces of impurities and flavorings. Traditionally, vodka is made through the distillation of cereal grains or potatoes that have been fermented, though some modern brands, such as Ciroc, CooranBong, and Bombora, use fruits or sugar.

Vodka is traditionally drank “neat” (not mixed with water, ice, or other mixer), though it is often served freezer chilled in the vodka belt countries of Belarus, Estonia, Finland, Iceland, Lithuania, Latvia, Norway, Poland, and Russia.

# ABOUT GIN

Gin is liquor which derives its predominant flavor from juniper berries. Gin is one of the broadest categories of spirits, all of various origins, styles, and flavor profiles that revolve around juniper as a common ingredient.

# WHAT IS TEQUILA

Tequila is a regional distilled beverage and type of alcoholic drink made from the blue agave plant, primarily in the area surrounding the city of Tequila of the central western Mexican state of Jalisco. Aside from differences in region of origin, tequila is a type of mezcal. The distinction is that tequila must use only blue agave plants rather than any type of agave. Tequila is commonly served neat in Mexico and as a shot with salt and lime across the rest of the world.

The red volcanic soil in the region around the city of Tequila is particularly well suited to the growing of the blue agave, and more than 300 million of the plants are harvested there each year. Agave grows differently depending on the region. Blue agaves grown in the highlands Los Altos region are larger in size and sweeter in aroma and taste. Agaves harvested in the lowlands, on the other hand, have a more herbaceous fragrance and flavor.

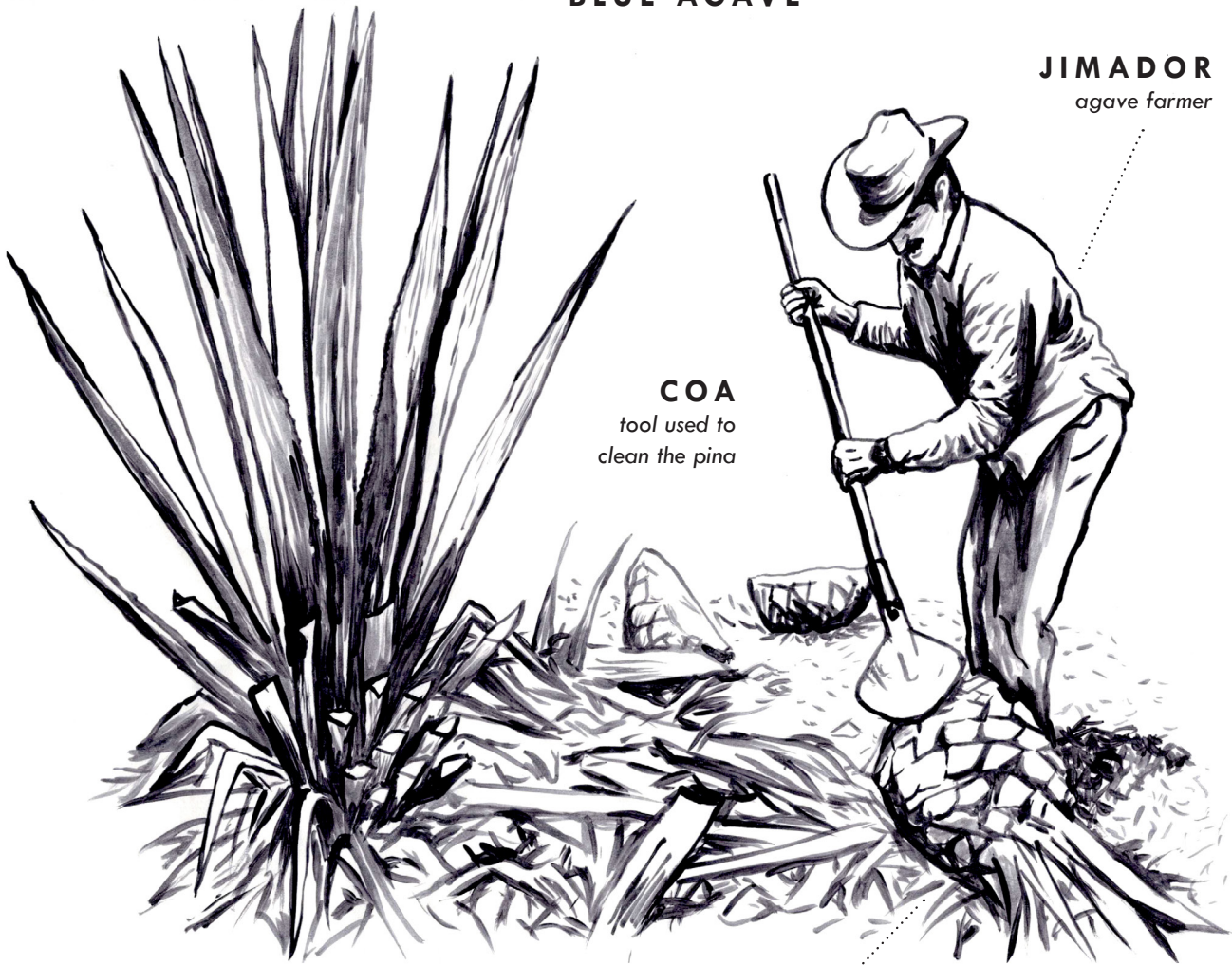

# WHAT IS MEZCAL

Mezcal is a distilled alcoholic beverage made from any type of agave. Agaves or magueys are found mainly in many parts of Mexico and all the way down to the equator, though most mezcal is made in Oaxaca. It is unclear whether distilled drinks were produced in Mexico before the Spanish Conquest. The Spaniards were introduced to native fermented drinks such as pulque, made from the maguey plant. Soon, the conquistadors began experimenting with the agave plant to find a way to make a distillable fermented mash. The result was mezcal.

Traditionally, mezcal is handcrafted by small-scale producers. The process begins by harvesting the plants, extracting the piña, or heart, by cutting off the plant's leaves and roots. The piñas are then cooked for about three days, often in pit ovens, which are earthen mounds over pits of hot rocks. This underground roasting gives mezcal its intense and distinctive smoky flavor. They are then crushed and mashed and allowed to ferment in large vats with water. That is collected and distilled in either clay or copper pots which will further modify the flavor of the final product.

# ABOUT RUM

Rum is a distilled alcoholic beverage made from sugarcane byproducts, such as molasses or honeys, or directly from sugarcane juice, by a process of fermentation and distillation. The distillate, a clear liquid, is then usually aged in oak barrels.

The majority of the world's rum production occurs in the Caribbean and Latin America. Rums are produced in various grades. Light rums are commonly used in cocktails, whereas "golden" and "dark" rums were typically consumed straight or neat, on the rocks, or used for cooking, but are now commonly consumed with mixers.

Rum plays a part in the culture of most islands of the West Indies as well as in The Maritimes and Newfoundland. This beverage has famous associations with the Royal Navy and piracy. Rum has also served as a popular medium of economic exchange, used to help fund enterprises such as slavery, organized crime, and military insurgencies (e.g., the American Revolution and Australia's Rum Rebellion).

## ABOUT COGNAC

Cognac is a type of brandy produced by double distilling white wines produced in any of the designated growing regions.

Among the specified grapes Ugni Blanc, known locally as Saint-Emilion, is most widely used. The brandy must be twice distilled in copper pot stills and aged at least two years in French oak barrels from Limousin or Tronçais. Cognac matures in the same way as whiskies and wine barrel age, and most cognacs spend considerably longer “on the wood” than the minimum legal requirement.

## ABOUT QUALITY GRADES

The official quality grades of cognac are the following:

**V.S. (Very Special)** designates a blend in which the youngest brandy has been stored for at least two years in cask.

**V.S.O.P. (Very Superior Old Pale) or Reserve** designates a blend in which the youngest brandy is stored for at least four years in a cask.

**XO (Extra Old) or Napoléon** currently designates a blend in which the youngest brandy is stored for at least six years.

**Hors d'âge (Beyond Age)** is a designation which BNIC states is equal to XO, but in practice the term is used by producers to market a high-quality product beyond the official age scale.

# ABOUT CORDIALS

A cordial, also known as a Liqueur, is an alcoholic beverage made from a distilled spirit flavored with either fruit, cream, herbs, spices, flowers or nuts, and is bottled with added sugars and other sweeteners. Cordials/Liqueurs are typically sweet and not aged for a large amount of time once the ingredients are mixed. A resting period during the production process allows the flavors to mingle.

Liqueurs are historical descendants of herbal medicines. They were made in Italy as early as the 13th century and were often prepared by monks (e.g. Chartreuse).

Nowadays, liqueurs are made worldwide and are served in many ways: by themselves, poured over ice, with coffee, or mixed with cream or other mixers to create cocktails.
